SPORTS COURT—the Sports Court was put in to play, so to speak, at the Pancake Breakfast with families having the opportunity to try it out. Every Wednesday afternoon in June featured instruction and practice for adults. Every session was well attended, **Laura and Ted Ferris, Nancy and Terry Gerber** with help from other experienced players, introduced the game to a good number of members who were eager to try out what is reputed to be the fastest growing sport in America.

The introduction was so successful that Laura Ferris organized our first annual tournament the morning of the 80th Celebration. Six doubles teams battled through a single elimination bracket. After all the serves, drop shots, passing shots and smoke from the volleys had cleared, **Janet Mc Millan and Walt Thieman** emerged as champions! During the evening Celebration they were recognized as champions and presented with the traveling trophy, a beautiful glass Christmas Pickle Ornament. Next year, the trophy will again be presented to the champions.

80TH ANNIVERSARY AND COMMODORE'S DINNER—160 people attended the event. **Mike and Nancy Sharpe**, who own **AAYS EVENT RENTALS**, volunteered to host the event and head up the planning committee. **NAVARRE HOSPITALITY GROUP** was selected to cater the dinner, which was a strolling gourmet experience including, among other things, a large grilled-on-site Red Snapper, a Poke Bar, and a wide assortment of delicious offerings. Both organizations sponsored the event and gave us deep discounts to enable members to

have a very special experience. For dessert, our own **Tommy Block, Bill Stoler and Don Kyle** prepared and flamed Bananas Foster for all the guests.

All attendees received a raffle ticket for a year's free membership the **DLYC** provided by the **Board of Governors**. The winner of the invaluable membership was **Donna and Don Pfeil**.

A very special moment involved the introduction of **Carol and Bob Wurster** who have been at every DLYC anniversary since the 25th Event.

We were also able to announce that the Board of Governors had voted to retire all 26 outstanding bonds valued at \$13,000 at this time. Marilyn Gardner will inform the owners and provide them instructions for processing their repayment. This also enabled us to announce that the Yacht Club is debt-free!

And finally, music for the evening was provided by **Knapp, Probst and Wolfe**.

It requires an incredible amount of energy and resource to plan and arrange an event of this magnitude. A number of members contributed financial donations to help underwrite the celebration. A large number of volunteers helped with program design, pamphlet publication, beautiful table decorations, commemorative clothing sales, and the physical work of setting up and taking down the materials. Special recognition goes to Marilyn Quackenbush who organized the preparation, printing and sales of the 80th Anniversary pamphlet. We have an impressive historical narrative of all 80 years of the Club's existence. Laurel Ward prepared, printed and assembled the evening's program. And Kath Stoler artistically arranged all of the flower centerpieces and accent pieces. The program lists these as well as other individuals. We will have a copy available at the Club for your review.

At the end of the day, it was such a good feeling to sit there and enjoy the moment. There were many positive comments that are so appreciated and are such a valued reward for all the hard work so many people generously offered.

At this stage in my life, I reflect quite a lot. Much of that has to do with the quality of life and what is satisfying. I really like being happy and contented. This environment goes a long way towards providing satisfaction. But I am positive the most important element is to be surrounded by people you like, enjoy and want to spend time with. So, thanks to many of you, I am a very happy man!

Thanks to everyone who volunteered to host a luncheon!






